It will be seen by the foregoing catalogue, that our class of the present session is a decided increase upon that of the last. We are happy in being able to say that this increase in numbers is not the only ground of encouragement. Each succeeding year shows an advance in the extent of preliminary preparation, and the higher aims of those who are seeking to fit themselves for practice of medicine and surgery. The character of our class for industry and zeal, intelligence and acquirements, no less than their number, warrants us in feeling a new assurance that our efforts thus far have been favorably received by the profession.

Since other and new avenues to wealth and fame have been opened with luring promises, to the young men of enterprise and talents in our country, within the last few years, the aggregate of medical students has been very much diminished, yet our class *in attendance* is an increase on the two preceding years. Our entire course has been given in the new edifice. At the beginning of the regular session two Lecture rooms were completed and have been occupied during the winter. Besides these, the dissecting room and a number of private rooms have been in use, and have been found admirably adapted to their several purposes. During the coming summer, further improvements, carrying out the original complete plan for Hospital, Museum, and Lecture Rooms will be prosecuted, so that we shall be able to welcome our next class to accommodations that will combine in a yet higher degree comfort and convenience.

Practical Anatomy can be pursued here as successfully and with less expense than in any of the northern or eastern cities.

The Cliniques continue interesting and important. During the present session some of the most important operations in Surgery have been performed; and we may reasonably expect that the means of clinical instruction will be constantly and rapidly in-
